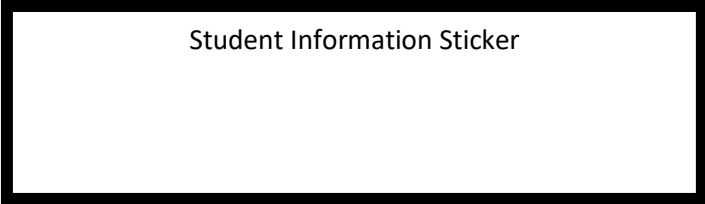


**ACTE:  
Individual/Group Website Design Rubric**



**Directions:**

1. Ask student/group for their portfolio. Students are only allowed 5 minutes for project set up. As they are setting up you will need to check the portfolio using the checklist below. Be sure to place all scores in the correct boxes. Some portfolios may be electronic and you will need to wait until it is ready to be viewed.
2. After this, the student/group will present the project to you. When the student/group is ready to present, judge the project and the presentation skills based on the rubric guidelines. The student/group has 10 minutes max to present the project. It is important to note that you may not see the entire project in 10 minutes, just what the student wishes you to see.
3. After the presentation, use the guided questions to ask about the project. You are not limited to these questions; they are just a suggestion. The question section of judging cannot exceed 5 minutes.
4. Be sure there are scores in each box, Add the Portfolio and Rubric Scores Together for a final score. Be sure to initial the scoring section of the rubric (on the back).

<b>PURPOSE</b> 0 – 20 Did all parts of the project work together for the intended purpose?	0 – 9 Little to none of the elements of the design fit the purpose of the project. Minimum amount of information. Many errors in grammar and spelling.	10 - 14 Elements of the project are not cohesive. Website does not fully serve its intended purpose. Navigation inconsistent. Few errors in grammar and spelling.	15 – 20 Layout and user interface consistent. Design and functionality impressive. No errors. Hyperlinks appropriate. Elements used enhance aesthetics and functionality of website.	
<b>UNDERSTANDING</b> 0 – 10 Did student(s) demonstrate a solid understanding of the software in development of the project?	0 – 5 Student displays little to no understanding of the software used to create the project.	6 – 9 Student has a good understanding of the material on the website. Can answer most questions on content and procedures.	10 Student can answer specific questions about project and software chosen. Exceptional understanding and mastery of software.
